You want the very best for your child, and so do we. YMCA Child Care is a place for children to explore, learn, and grow, and feel safe, cared for and celebrated. We encourage positive relationships between children, staff, and parents to ensure a high-quality experience.

In every program, and every classroom, we address the specific needs of children based not only on age, but also individual pace of development. We believe the values and skills learned early on are vital building blocks for quality of life and future success.

At the YMCA, babies develop trust and security; toddlers learn to explore their world; preschoolers experience early literacy and math; school-age kids make friends and learn new skills. Most importantly, children learn how to be their best selves. That makes for confident kids today, and contributing and engaged adults tomorrow.

In accordance with our goals and philosophy, our program is playbased. Each day your child will be provided time for free play with a wide variety of materials and spaces. Some activities are teacher planned and guided, but each child can freely choose which activity, materials or space they wish to use. The YMCA strives to challenge and stimulate each child at their own developmental level and foster a positive self image by accepting each child as an individual.

The safety and health of your child is our top priority. That's why the YMCA Early Learning Centers go above and beyond state licensing requirements to achieve high rankings through the Bright & Early North Dakota system to give your child the very best.

YMCA Early Learning Centers also participate in SEEDS of Learning, a professional development program for early childhood educators. Our teachers are continully learning to provide the best care possible for your child.

Quality Staff

Child care staff are CPR and First Aid Certified and have passed background checks based on state licensing requirements. Staff continue to grow with ongoing professional development opportunities.

Early Learning

Teachers have a degree in Early Child Education (or related field), or a Child Development Credential and practical experience working with young children. Warm, caring teachers bond and develop trust with families. Each child has a primary caregiver, your main point of contact, to guide your child's development.

School Age Learning

Site Coordinators have a degree in Elementary Education (or related field), or a Child Development Credential and practical experience working with school-age children. A majority of our general staff are local students interested in making a difference in our community.

Learning Healthy Lifestyles

Your child shares meals and snacks with their peers, where they learn to make healthy food choices. All meals exceed USDA requirements, as we follow the Healthy Eating Standards put forth by the YMCA of the USA. These standards include a fruit or vegetable at every meal, water or milk as a beverage, 60 minutes of physical activity per day, and limited screen time per day (no screen time is given to children under four). Screen time is limited to educational viewing only.

Stay Connected


Families are welcome visitors to our programs at all times. We hope that parents/guardians will attend family functions, help with classroom projects, and attend field trips with us. We encourage families to join us for lunch. Just give us a heads up and we'll make sure to prepare additional meals.

Families meet at least twice a year with their child's Teacher to discuss their child's development for infants through preschoolers. Families may continue to meet with child care staff as needed on an ongoing basis.

Parents also have the opportunity to stay connected using our ProCare mobile app, receiving regular updates and frequent pictures, so you'll always be connected to your child throughout the week!

Membership Benefits

YMCA Child Care families can join the YMCA's fitness facilities and pay a discounted monthly rate! Membership includes access to Fitness Centers, Group Fitness Studios, the Aquatic Center, Basketball Gyms, Climbing Wall, and lots of spaces to play with as a family, like the Play Loft, Kids' Gym, and Xerzones! The Family Household Package membership even includes access to PlayTown (drop-in child care) for up to two hours/day for children ages eight years and younger.

LITTLE ONES Ages 6 weeks - 3 years

In YMCA Child Care, children feel safe, secure, and happy while watching and absorbing knowledge and skills from everything and everyone around them. Teachers strive to attain balance and harmony with your child's home schedule - this means that we work with families to establish the right eating and sleeping routines for your child. We believe high quality child care is a partnership – together, we'll give your child the best start possible.



TODDLERS 19 months - 3 years

Toddler classrooms maintain a ratio of 1 adult : 5 toddlers.

Toddlers love to move, discover, and play! We provide quidance as they develop their skills, gain independence, and master milestones. In the toddler classrooms, we use The Creative Curriculum[®], an award-winning, research-validated curriculum to guide this increasingly independent age group. Toddlers spend their day exploring materials in the block area, science center, art station, and outside for gross motor play. In addition, toddlers spend daily group time together enjoying painting projects, story time, sensory activities, and themed lessons like letters, sign language, colors, seasons, shapes, and more that foster their development.

INFANTS 6 weeks - 18 months

Infant classrooms maintain a ratio of 1 adult: 4 infants.

Infants learn through active, hands-on play with activities that help them learn and master new skills. That's why our classrooms are staffed with people who understand the cognitive, physical, and social development of infants, as little ones need to feel connected and supported. Our infant's daily schedules are based on the individual needs of the child. Infants spend their day playing with sensory objects and toys, enjoying stroller walks outside, and participating in activites like bubbles, water buckets, finger painting, dancing, and more.

Teachers work closely with families to introduce foods to your child timely and safely. All meals and formula are provided by the YMCA. Mothers may choose to provide their own milk and are welcome to stop in anytime during the day to nurse.



EARLY HEAD START PROGRAM Together, the Mayville State University Child Development Program and the YMCA of Cass and Clay Counties provide Early Head Start services to eliqible families at our West Fargo and South Learning Centers! Early Head Start is an income-based program that provides families with quality child care. Early Head Start is for ages six weeks through two years. PRESCHOOL Ages 3-5

Ready for a Bright Start in School

Our preschool programs use The Creative Curriculum. This curriculum was specifically chosen because it prepares children for a smooth transition into kindergarten. The curriculum supports skills in the areas of language development, communication, body awareness, character development, and socialization skills. Children learn how to play politely, take turns, listen to their teachers, clean up after themselves, and take responsibility.

Full Day Preschool 3 - 5 years

Full day preschool is a licensed, full day, year-round school readiness program. You have the flexibility to drop off and pick up your child anytime between 6:30am – 6:00pm.

Preschool classrooms maintain the following ratios: 3-year-olds are 1 adult: 7 children. 4-year-olds are 1 adult: ten children. 5-year-olds are 1 adult: 12 children.



Half Day Preschool 3 - 5 years

Kindergarten Readiness is the YMCA's licensed morning program that runs from September – May. Children must be three years old and fully potty trained by September 1 of the year you plan to enroll your child.

Early Childhood Development Classrooms

4+ years

The program is offered to four-year olds living in the West Fargo school district.

Early Childhood Development Classrooms (ECDC) are a partnership between the YMCA, West Fargo Public School District, and United Way of Cass-Clay. ECDC is a low income-based program that provides families with quality early learning experience. Children in the program have the opportunity to work with Reading Corps, a program that provides evidence-based literacy interventions, assessments, and lesson plans to help children with development.

Daily Activities

Children join their friends in an interactive large group experience to engage the brain and talk about weekly themes, calendar, weather, letters, shapes, colors, and numbers.

Children focus their energy on reading and writing. They also use their imagination through creative art.

Play is a child's work. Children are encouraged to socialize in a variety of learning centers such as dramatic play, art, sand and water, library, construction, science, and games.

Children experience large motor activities to move their bodies and pump their heart. At the Fercho and Schlossman YMCAs, children utilize other areas of the facility like play areas and the Aquatic Center (Fercho).

Quality literature is read aloud to children.

Lunch and snacks is included in your tuition. Meals are served `family style' to make meal time a pleasant social experience. Manners are practiced during meal times.

Transportation is provided for full-day preschoolers to participate in swimming lessons and other activities at various YMCA sites. Opportunities to register for these programs are shared throughout the year.

SCHOOL AGE Grades K-5

Reaching Their Full Potential

YMCA School Age Programs offer before and after school fun and learning during the school year and full day programming during the summer months. Incorporating the latest research in youth development, the YMCA of the USA has developed a unique program model for grades K–5 that combines fun with learning and exploration. The careful balance between social time, educational activities, and physical activities makes the YMCA so much more than "just" after school child care.



Curriculum

In the School Age Program, kids love using their hands along with their brains to take our daily plans to the next level. Along with physical games and activities outside and in the gym, we also allow children to choose their focus each day in activity areas like arts and crafts, music and drama, science, technology, math, reading, and more.

We strive to make every child knowledgeable of our core values — caring, honesty, respect, responsibility, and health — through character development lessons and role modeling.

Daily Activities

Children share lunch and snack family style with their peers to promote social skills and using manners.

Children can freely explore interests with friends in our many learning centers, from Art and Makerspace to Science and Math.

Whether it is playing on the playground or an organized game in the gym, children are physicaly active every day!

Our signature Explore Zone activity time provides children hands-on learning opportunities to conduct science experiments, complete art projects, develop their talents, and explore their interests in many hands-on activities.

Children are encouraged to find and use their strengths. Character development inspires kids to become ethical, responsible citizens through engaging conversations and activities.

Quality literature is shared through group reading, buddy reading, and individual reading time.



School Out Days Don't forget: When school is out, we stay open! YMCA Learning Centers are open from 6:30am – 6:00pm on days when there is no school. Each day is packed with activities to keep minds sharp and bodies moving. Kids will unplug from technology and engage in fun activities and socialize with friends. Breakfast, snack, and lunch provided! Children not currently participating in a YMCA School Age Progmram are welcome to participate in School Out Days, so we encourage participants to invite their friends!
